#### 1.0 APPLICATION

- 1.1 The Applicant is Jodie Christina Mary Hallam, Britannia Inn,56 Old Hall Road, Brampton, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 1HD.
- 1.2 The premises, in respect of the application, is the Britannia Inn, 56 Old Hall Road, Brampton, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 1HD.

#### 2.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

2.1 For Members to determine whether or not to add conditions or to issue a counter-notice in respect of the application following an objection made by Environmental Protection (Chesterfield Borough Council – Responsible Authority).

#### 3.0 PROPOSED TEMPORARY EVENTS

3.1 On 7<sup>th</sup> November 2013, the Licensing Authority received an application from Jodie Christina Mary Hallam for a temporary event to take place on Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> December 2013 at the Britannia Inn, 56 Old Hall Road, Brampton, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 1HD (Appendix A).

3.2 The temporary event is for a New Year's Eve Party and for the Public House to apply for the sale by retail of alcohol on and off the premises, and for the provision of regulated entertainment. The timings for the event will be a live band between 19.30 – 23.30, recorded music between 23.30 – 01.30 and an outside Bar between 19.30 – 01.30. All these activities are to take place in a marquee on the Britannia Inn Car Park area.

Miss Hallam has stated in her application that there will be a maximum of 200 persons at any one time (the maximum permitted number of persons at any one time at a temporary event under the Licensing Act 2003 is 499).

3.3 Miss Hallam is a Personal Licence holder with Chesterfield Borough Council, Number PA/VF/0845 (expires 11<sup>th</sup> July 2020).

#### 4.0 OBJECTION BY ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH.

4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 (section 106) does give Environmental Protection, the power, with the agreement of the applicant, to modify the temporary event notice at any time before a hearing is held or dispensed with. Richard Harris from Environmental Protection has been in discussion with the applicant to agree a modification on the TEN to allow the event to take place but to restrict the timings for outdoor live and recorded music ending at 22.30 pm. The applicant did not wish to modify the timings and confirmed this in an e-mail to Mr Harris on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2013 (Appendix B).

This application for a standard TEN is therefore referred to the Licensing Committee for their determination.

4.2 Following receipt of the e-mail, Mr Harris submitted notice of the objection from Environmental Protection to the Licensing Authority on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2013. A copy of the objection is attached to the report at Appendix C.

#### 5.0 **OPTIONS**

5.1 Having regard to the objection notice given by Environmental Protection, a counter-notice must be given to the applicant if the Committee considers it necessary if any of the licensing objectives would be undermined.

- 5.2 The Committee does have the power in this type of application to attach conditions on the temporary event but any such condition(s) must be derived from the conditions contained in the Premises Licence (Appendix D).
- 5.3 Either the Committee decides to issue a counter-notice (if it is necessary to do so to prevent the undermining of any of the licensing objectives, in which case the licensable activity at the temporary event is prohibited, or if the Committee decides not to issue a counter-notice (if it is satisfied that the licensing objective will not be undermined), in which case the licensable activity will be permitted.

#### 6.0 **RECOMMENDATION**

6.1 That Members determine whether or not to add conditions on to the TEN or issue a counter-notice in respect of the application for a temporary event at the Britannia Inn, 56 Old Hall Road, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 1HD.

- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on the licensed premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act):
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less:

- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

In conditions numbered 3, 4 and 5 above, "responsible person" means-

- (i) the holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence, or
- (iii) any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by such a holder or supervisor.

#### These Conditions will be in force from 1st October 2010

- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

#### ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The following text is from the Operating Schedule

#### **General - All Four Licensing Objectives**

The types of regulated entertainment proposed reinstate and then enhance the normal pub entertainments that were previously unregulated, with the benefit to enhance the local facilities for social entertainment and reduce the focus on alcohol.

Staff will be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 when they are recruited and given training in "drugs awareness" as part of their induction.

No new steps have been identified in relation to the four licensing objectives, except as below. I have considered the terms of your local licensing policy in preparing this application.

#### Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Providing a 30 minute extension of opening hours after the end of the sale of alcohol will promote this objective as the last drink will be consumed less quickly, with access to the pubs toilet facilities and the provision of non-alcoholic refreshment during this period.

The DPS will be a member of the local Pubwatch so long as it exists.

No less than 14 working days written notice will be provided to police, if they require it, when "events days" are planned. SEE MODIFICATION BELOW

#### **Public Safety**

Capacity will be assessed with the advice of the Fire Services fire evacuation policy and will be continuously updated.

My risk assessment identified no risk of crowding.

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

Live music will end at 00.00 except on New Years Eve, live or recorded music in the garden or in temporary marquee or shelter will end at or before 22.30.

All windows will be kept closed after 23.00.

Prominent notices will be placed at all exits asking customers to leave quietly.

#### Protection of Children from Harm
