### 1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 To report on representations made during the consultation on a proposal to increase taxi fees and charges from 1 April 2024 and a reduction in vehicles licence fees from June 2024.

### 2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The committee considered a report on increased fees and charges for several regulatory areas on 29 November 2023 and approved increases from 1 April 2024. A copy of that report and appendices is attached at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 To facilitate the increase for the taxi trade, the proposed fees and charges had to be advertised and consulted on. The consultation ended on 15 February 2024 and representations were made.
- 2.3 The representations are reproduced in full at Appendix 2, essentially arguing against the increase in fees at a time of prices increasing.
- 2.4 A change to vehicle licensing procedures is due to be implemented in June 2024 with a change to the design of vehicle licence plates. Due to this change the cost of materials will be reduced. The proposed reduction in vehicle licence fee's is attached at Appendix 3.

## 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The proposed increases will enable the council to provide these services as close to cost neutral as possible.

## 4.0 **RECOMMENDATION**

4.1 Approval is given to the increases agreed on 29 November 2023 with a reduction to vehicle licence fees from June 2024.

### 1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 To seek approval for revised licence and registration fees for 2024/25.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATION

Approval is given to an increase in fees and charges as outlined in Appendix A from 1 April 2024.

#### 3.0 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 In accordance with the Council's financial regulations it is necessary for all fees to be annually reviewed.
- 3.2 The services relate to the regulation, control and administration of the following areas:
  - Private Hire and Hackney Carriage fees;
  - Scrap Metal collectors and sites;
  - Miscellaneous licensing fees.
- 3.3 Fees for the Licensing Act 2003 are set nationally and cannot be altered by the Council.
- 3.4 Fees under the Gambling Act and for sexual entertainment venues are considered by the Licensing committee.

- 3.5 Members are reminded that these are statutory services and as such are not subject to market forces. The Council has discretion about the setting of fees.
- 3.6 The proposed increases are in line with the current level of inflation at 7%.

## 4.0 **SCOPE**

- 4.1 An increase is required for all fees and charges in the current circumstances. A summary of proposed fees is provided at Appendix A, which sets out the fees and charges that were agreed in 2023/24 and the proposed increase; the figures have been rounded up or down to assist with cash handling.
- 4.2 Legal precedents dictate that licensing authorities should not make a profit from the delivery of these services. The proposed increases will maintain a cost-neutral position.

## 5.0 EXCEPTIONAL ITEMS

- 5.1 In December 2022 members decided to retain the limit of 110 hackney carriages. The committee also decided to commission another unmet demand survey in 2025, the survey to be funded by hackney carriage licence holders, for which licence holders are charged £10 at each six-month renewal.
- 5.2 The consumable licensing items are subject to price changes by our supplier. Appendix A shows the costs recharged on the current stock but prices will be adjusted when suppliers alter the costs to us.
- 5.3 Appendix B shows the comparison of taxi and private hire fees within Derbyshire but does not indicate what increase, if any, those authorities are proposing.

## 6.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 At present these budgets have averaged out to where there is a growing deficit, an increase in line with those proposed at appendix A will move them closer to being cost-neutral.

## 7.0 RECOMMENDATION

7.1 Approval is given to an increase in fees and charges as outlined in Appendix A from 1 April 2024.

## 1 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 To consider amendments to the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy.

## 2.0 <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

2.1 The proposed amendments are adopted in line with a change to the vehicle licensing process and the relocation of the licensing team.

## 3.0 REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

3.1 The amendments will provide greater clarity in terms of taxi regulation and will not adversely affect public safety.

## 4.0 BACKGROUND

4.1 Vehicle licensing



- 4.2 To amend paragraphs 1.8, 2.10, 2.21 and 5.17 of the hackney carriage and private hire licensing policy to reflect a change to the vehicle licensing process and remove references to North East Derbyshire District Council's (NEDDC) testing station.
- 4.3 Currently vehicles must be tested at NEDDC's testing station who then issue the vehicle licence plates. The contract we hold with them is due to end in June 2024 so the process for licensing vehicles will change. This change will allow vehicles to have an MOT test at any testing station and the vehicle licence plates will be issued by Chesterfield Borough Council.
- 4.4 The change of process has been agreed by senior management and the cabinet member for health and wellbeing.
- 4.5 Change of location of the licensing team
- 4.6 To remove the reference of the customer service centre in paragraph 5.7 and replace with the Town Hall.

# 5.0 EQUALITIES IMPACT ASSESSMENT

5.1 A preliminary equalities impact assessment has been conducted and is attached at Appendix 1. The conclusion was that a full assessment was not required as the proposed changes to the policy will not have any adverse impact with regard to the protected characteristics.

# 6.0 RISK MANAGEMENT

6.1 A full risk management assessment has not been completed but this measure will not endanger public safety.
