Two responses were received, as follows

Barnsley MBC (Chief Executive) responded to say that 'this is a thorough and substantial piece of work'.

Derbyshire County Council (Chief Executive) responded as follows:

I am pleased that you have acknowledged the need to undertake a full equality impact assessment and I appreciate the sentiment of inviting our input. However, quite frankly, this invitation has been received at such a late stage in the process as to make it meaningless since I simply do not have time to do justice to the issues involved. In the circumstances, I simply note the document which has been produced and reserve our position on its adequacy in relation to your Council's public sector equality duty.

A reply to the county council was sent on 24th March to clarify that the timetable has arisen from a combination of government process and the county council's own challenge to the decision made by CBC. It also re-iterated that the request included any <u>existing</u> material available regarding consideration that the county council had given to the equality impacts across Derbyshire of its own decisions regarding support of a combined authority and devolution deal, given that no such material is available in the public domain.
