

## Consultation on proposed changes to the Council's Allocations Policy Questionnaire Report

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## 1. Summary

Questionnaire format: Paper questionnaire with online version available

Responses: Total 887 (Paper: 814) (Web: 73)

Date range: 8<sup>th</sup> August 2018 – 24<sup>th</sup> September 2018

### 2. Introduction

Chesterfield Borough Council undertook a consultation about the proposed changes to the Council's Housing Allocations Policy. The consultation pack (which included: a cover letter including background information, questionnaire, and an information sheet summarising the key changes to the policy) was sent to all CBC tenants, and also to all those currently on the housing waiting list. The consultation was also promoted on the Council's website, and four 'roadshow' events were held around the Borough for tenants to drop in during the consultation period.

A total of 887 responses were received, giving a response rate of 9%. 92% of the responses received were in paper form, with the remaining 8% being completed online.

Background information included in the cover letter explained that:

Chesterfield Borough Council is in the process of joining the Home Options Partnership made up of Amber Valley Borough Council, Dales Housing, Derbyshire Dales District Council, East

Midlands Housing, Erewash Borough Council, Futures Housing Group, High Peak Borough Council, Staffordshire Moorlands District Council and Your Housing Group.

It is proposed that Chesterfield Borough Council adopts the Home Options Allocations Policy. The allocations policy is similar for each partner but allows partners to include their own local differences.

The aim of the policy is to enable the council's Housing Options Team to improve how it allocates council properties to those in need, and to reduce the number of empty properties. Adopting the Home Options Allocation Policy will enable the council and our customers to benefit from:

- An on-line rehousing application
- Introduction of a simplified priority band system
- Ability to assess medical need using category groups
- Revision of residency requirement criteria
- Acceptance of out of borough applicants on to the housing register
- Introduction of an equity assessment
- Introduction of a time restriction on reapplying to the housing register after being rehoused
- Revision of property size (number of bedrooms) eligibility criteria
- Introduction of a pre-allocation financial assessment of affordability
- Revision of the housing register exclusion times and financial levels
- Alignment of the allocations policy with the Adaptations Policy 2017

Questionnaire respondents were asked to indicate the type of impact they anticipated each change to the policy would have in general, and then whether they felt the changes would impact on them personally. Space was made so that respondents could provide further details about their responses. The questionnaire is available at appendix 1.

## 3. Questionnaire results

# Q1. Are you currently on Chesterfield Borough Council's housing register? Around half of the questionnaire respondents are currently on the Council's housing register, and 227 of these respondents are also existing CBC tenants.

## Q2. What type of property are you hoping to be allocated?

Only those respondents that answered 'yes' to Q1 responded to this question. A high of 55.8% of respondents indicated 'bungalow', followed by 24.7% of respondents indicating 'house'.

## Q5a. If you have ticked 'potentially negative' to any of the changes listed, please tell us what you think the impact will be.

The bullet points below summarise the themes of the comments received about potentially negative impacts of the proposed changes.

- Application form comments in relation to lack of access to internet
- Priority banding comments in relation to disability and or long term conditions, and that need should be a higher priority than date, some comments in support of existing priority banding
- Homelessness comments about homelessness becoming worse in Chesterfield, concerns about opening up to people outside Chesterfield
- Medical priority comments in relation to mental health, GP workload
- Local residency comments about widening the geographical area
- Re-registration after rehousing comments about two years being a long time to wait
- Equity comments with regard to equity levels
- Owner occupiers comments that owner occupiers may not be able to afford a property to meet their needs
- Financial assessment queries about the details of the financial assessment, concerns about what happens to those that can't 'pass' the financial assessment.
- Children in flats comments about flats not being suitable for children for reasons such as lack of access to outside space for play, stairs, noise etc
- Exclusion for unacceptable behaviour comments in support of existing timescales for exclusion due to unacceptable behaviour, or to lengthen it
- Amending application date due to change of circumstances comments disagreeing
- Applicants not bidding comments about being penalised for not bidding when properties are not considered suitable by applicant
- Applicants refusing reasonable offers –comments querying what is considered a reasonable offer
- Applicants aged 16 and 17 –concerns about 16 and 17 year olds being able to manage a tenancy

## Q6. Do you think the proposed changes will have an impact on you personally?

34.4% of respondents indicated that they don't think the proposed changes will have an impact on them personally. A further 9.5% of respondents indicated 'yes' the proposed changes will affect them, and 32.7% indicated 'maybe'. 23.4% of respondents were unsure whether or not the proposed changes would affect them.
