ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Retailing of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

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- 3. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on the licensed premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following
- activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into

the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

In conditions numbered 3, 4 and 5 above, "responsible person" means-

- (i) the holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence, or
- (iii) any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by such a holder or supervisor.

These Conditions will be in force from 1st October 2010

- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint:
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Door Supervision

Each individual carrying out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security **Industry Authority.**

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The following text is from the Operating Schedule

General - All Four Licensing Objectives

See below.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The management will be a member of Pub Watch.

All bar staff will be fully trained to minimise the risk of the sale of alcohol to persons under 18, in responsible drinking policies and drugs surveillance awareness.

The managers will follow and comply with national guidance and implement policies such as the code of practice produced by the Portman Group to promote socially responsible drinking. CCTV cameras will be positioned inside and outside the premises.

The CCTV cameras will be maintained in good working order with the provision of suitable practical training for staff.

The number of cameras, their positions and the method and duration of recordings (with a minimum of 28 days recording retained) will be in accordance with the recommendations of the Business Crime Prevention Officer.

The premises will contain appropriate signage and crime prevention notices and will carry out appropriate risk assessments as are required from time to time including where appropriate risk assessment to determine the necessity for door supervisors.

Public Safety

All staff will be trained in fire escape procedures and the building will fully comply with building regulations.

Recommended capacity limits will be adhered to.

All health and safety at work, fire precautions and other relevant legislation will be complied with. All equipment will be adequately maintained and tested at regular intervals and staff will be trained to recognise and minimise risks associated with drugs misuse.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

There will be signage cautioning customers from making any noise when leaving the premises late at night.

Music will be controlled so as to prevent noise and vibration escaping from the premises including adequate sound proofing.



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The sound level of music will be controlled so as to prevent it being audible outside the premises or in the case of outdoor events to be inaudible off the site.

The sitting and design of kitchen extraction and ventilation systems will be such as to minimise noise and vibration escaping from the premises.

Protection of Children from Harm

Children will only be admitted to the premises when accompanied by an adult and will not be served food or any beverage other than when in the presence of a responsible parent. Full training is provided to staff on commencement of employment on relevant current legislation and any system or procedures they are expected to follow in the course of their working capacity.

Refresher training should be provided at regular intervals (at least 6 monthly).

Records detailing the training provided will be kept on the premises for a minimum of 2 years for production, on request, to a Constable or an authorised officer of a Responsible Authority.

A" Challenge 25" (or similar) Proof of Age Scheme will be operated and all staff and managers will have to undertake due diligence in relation to this.

Anyone attempting to purchase alcohol and who appears to be under the age of 25 years will be asked for proof of age; acceptable forms of ID being PASS accredited card, photo driving licence or passport.

Failure to produce satisfactory proof of age will result in a refused sale.

Clear, prominent and unobstructed signage of the scheme will be displayed at all public entry points and at points of sale.

A system of recording all sales refused will be operated at all times.

At least weekly, the Designated Premises Supervisor (or authorised deputy) will examine the record and compare it against the normal operating pattern for the premises, indicating any action taken in relation to that examination.

The refusal record shall be kept on the premises for a minimum period of 2 years for production, on request, to a Constable or an authorised officer of a Responsible Authority.

There will be no performances of dancing or otherwise which would be unsuitable for children.
