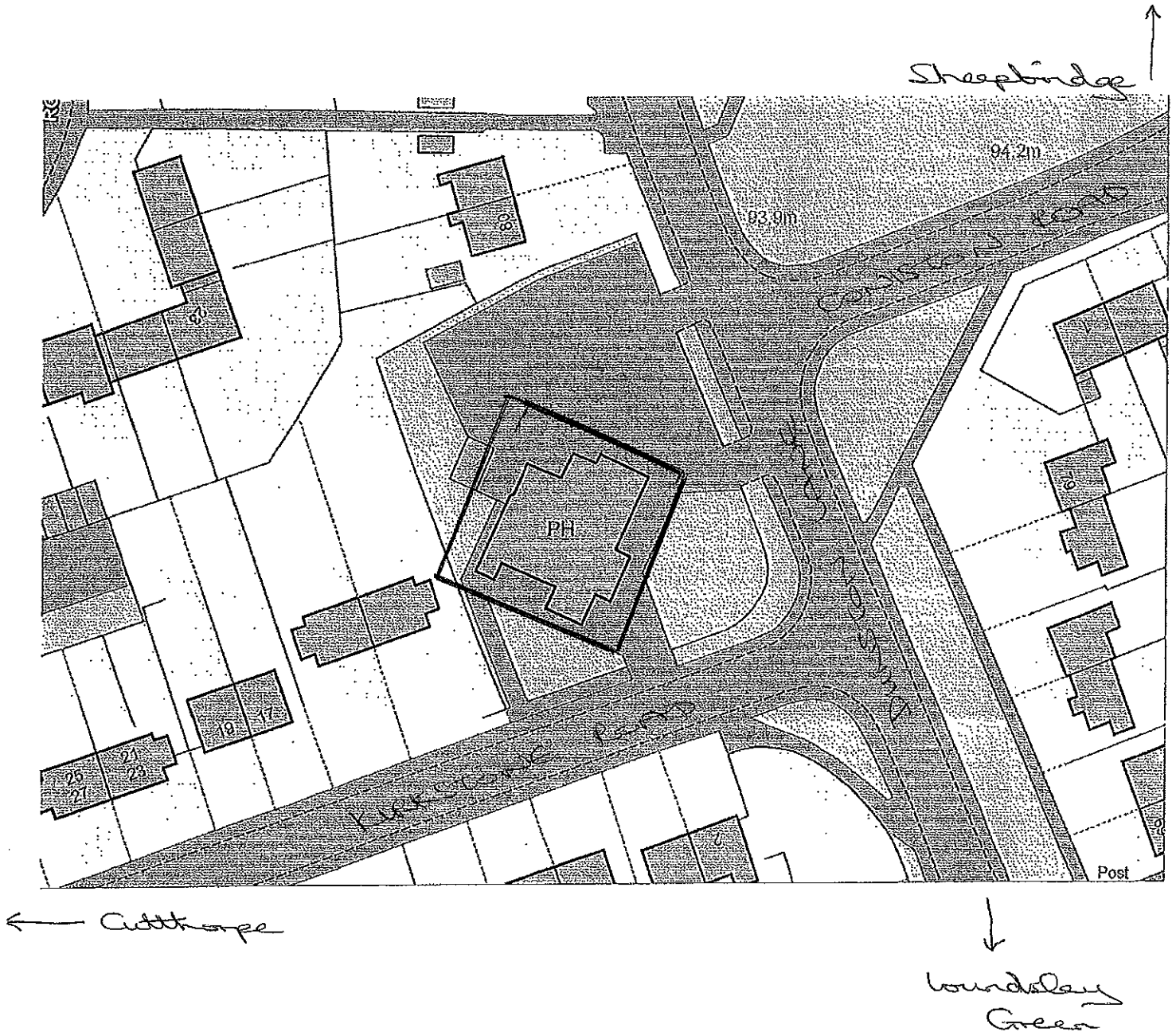

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Retailing of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Irresponsible Promotions

3. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on the licensed premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Dispensing alcohol directly into the mouth

4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

Free tap water

5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

In conditions numbered 3, 4 and 5 above, "responsible person" means-

- (i) the holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence, or
- (iii) any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by such a holder or supervisor.

Age-verification

6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Smaller Measures

7. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Exhibition of Films

The admission of any person aged under 18 to the exhibition of any film at the premises is restricted in accordance with Section 20 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Door Supervision

Each individual carrying out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

I have undertaken my own risk assessment to take the following proposed steps. The types of regulated entertainment proposed materially do no more than reinstate the normal pub entertainment that was previously unregulated as identified in part 3 above. No new steps have been identified in relation to the four licensing objectives save as below.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. Any person exercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2(1)(a) of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
2. Such a person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the premises licence.
3. Any person as defined in condition (1) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty.
4. No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.
5. Where CCTV is installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 30 days and made available within a reasonable time upon request by the police.
6. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
7. The use of door staff will be risk assessed by management on an ongoing basis and door staff will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor/Premises Licence Holder. Door staff will be equipped with radio pagers.
8. Regular drugs checks will be made at the premises and the premises will operate a zero tolerance policy in relation to drugs.
9. The trading areas will be supervised by management and staff.
10. The premises will operate a recognised Proof of Age Scheme. Those appearing to be under eighteen will be asked to produce an accepted form of photographic identification.

Public Safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
2. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the building control officer.
3. The premises will have policies in place to ensure that spillages and breakages are dealt with promptly; all staff are trained and familiar with evacuation procedures; and staff will receive regular health, safety, alcohol and emergency training.
