Certification of claims and returns - annual report 2013/14

The Audit Commission requires its external auditors to prepare an annual report on the claims and returns it certifies for each client. This letter is our annual report for the certification work we have undertaken for 2013/14.

In 2013/14 we carried out certification work on the following claims/returns:

Matters Arising

The certification work did identify three errors with the housing benefits subsidy claim/return, but we were able to certify the claim/return unqualified. Staff were proactive in responding to the errors and promptly carried out additional work that allowed the full extent of all similar errors to be identified, tested and an adjustment to be made to the claim.

Given the scale and complexity of this claim, the amendments were for relatively minor amounts and issues. However, DWP rules require that all issues are reported or amended regardless of size.

Due to the pro-active approach taken by staff in following up these issues and promptly identifying a resolution, we have made no recommendations to the Authority to improve its claims completion process. There were no recommendations made last year and there are no further matters to report to you regarding our certification work.

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Certification work fees

The Audit Commission set an indicative fee for our certification work in 2013/14 of £8,975. Our actual fee was the same as the indicative fee. This is lower than the 2012/13 fee for these claims of £10,020. The main reason for this is due to the removal of council tax benefits from the housing benefits subsidy claim certification process with effect from 1 April 2013.
