106 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors A Diouf, Hill and P Innes.

107 NEW ANIMAL LICENSING LEGISLATION AND FEES 2018/19 (A270)

The Senior Environmental Health Officer presented a report on the new statutory Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities Involving Animals) (England) Regulations 2018 and recommending the delegation of decisions in relation to the determination of licences and enforcement action to the Assistant Director in Health and Wellbeing and Environmental Health Team Leader (Food and Health and Safety and Communicable Disease) by the 1st October 2018 and the adoption of the proposed fees and charges in relation to animal licensing as of 1st October 2018.

The report outlined the background to the new legislation which amalgamated and replaced a number of pieces of legislation that governed the licensing of animals and allowed licensing authorities to charge a reasonable amount to cover the cost of considering the grant,

renewal or variation of a licence without generating a profit from these charges. It explained the processes for dealing with appeals against the authority's decision to grant or renew a licence or to revoke a licence and for hearing representations against decisions to vary or suspend a licence or to impose conditions on a licence.

Details of the proposed fees and charges were included at paragraph 4.7 of the report. It was confirmed that these fees and charges were calculated to cover the expected costs to the Council of activities in relation to animal licensing, including additional training of staff.

* RESOLVED -

- (1) That from 1 October 2018, the power to determine appeals against decisions to vary or suspend licences be delegated to the Assistant Director for Health and Wellbeing, or where the Assistant Director believes that there is wider social or economic issues being raised by the written representation, to be heard by a panel of the Appeals and Regulatory Committee.
- (2) That from 1 October 2018, the power to decide to commence enforcement action and to determine appeals against a risk assessment score be delegated to the Assistant Director for Health and Wellbeing and/or their authorised delegate (in accordance with the requirements detailed in the "The Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities Involving Animals) (England) Regulations 2018 Procedural guidance notes for local authorities July 2018").
- (3) That from 1st October 2018, the proposed fees and charges in relation to animal licensing set out in paragraph 4.7 of this report be adopted.
- (4) That the Local Government and Regulatory Law Manager be delegated authority to draft appropriate amendments to the Council's constitution to allow representations by licence holders against the variation or suspension of licences to be determined by the Assistant Director for Health and Wellbeing, or where the Assistant Director believes that there is wider social or economic issues being raised by the written representation, by a panel of the Appeals and Regulatory Committee.

(5) That the Local Government and Regulatory Law Manager be delegated authority to draft appropriate amendments to the Council's constitution to allow appeals against risk assessment scores to be determined by the Assistant Director for Health and Wellbeing.

115 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Bingham, A Diouf, Miles, Niblock and Perkins.

116 <u>HACKNEY CARRIAGE AND PRIVATE HIRE LICENSING POLICY - POLICY AMENDMENTS (A000)</u>

The Licensing Manager submitted a report for Members to consider proposed amendments to the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy.

The report explained the reasons for the proposed amendments to the policy, covering the following issues:

- Adoption of the National Anti-Fraud Network (NAFN) database of refusals and revocations:
- Consideration of convictions to commence from the completion of any sentence imposed, rather than the date of conviction, in line with recent Institute of Licensing guidance;
- 3) Introduction of a computerised knowledge test, which would lead to more test appointments being available;

- 4) Payment of an initial application fee, which would be deducted from the rest of the existing fee payable once the application had been successful;
- 5) A requirement for licensed private hire drivers to notify the Council which private hire operator they are to work for;
- 6) Amendment of the code of conduct to ensure equivalent standards for men and women in line with recent advice from the government's Equality Office;
- 7) Replacement of the requirement for applicants to provide financial references with a self-declaration form.

It was noted that a recent Department for Transport report had recommended the establishment of national minimum standards for taxi applications for consideration by the Secretary of State.

It was confirmed that there would be a one month period of consultation on the proposed amendments to the policy, including at the next meeting of the Taxi Consultative Committee on 24 October and notification to all licensed drivers and operators.

* RESOLVED -

That the proposed policy amendments be approved for a one month period of consultation, including:

- Adoption of the NAFN database of refusals and revocations;
- Consideration of previous convictions from the completion of any sentence imposed, not the date of conviction;
- Knowledge tests to be administered by a computerised system when appropriate;
- Applicants for a taxi driver's licence to pay an initial fee to cover the process up to the point their application is determined, the fee to be non-refundable;
- Drivers of private hire vehicles to notify the Council of which operator they are working for before they drive the vehicle;
- The code of conduct is amended with regard to the wording of the dress code;
- The requirement for a financial reference to be replaced by a selfdeclaration as to a person's finances.

117 TAXI CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2017/18

Councillor Caulfield, Chair of the Taxi Consultative Committee, presented the Committee's annual report for 2017/18.

The report provided details of the Committee's membership and meetings held during 2017/18 and outlined the issues which had been considered during the year.

It was noted that the Committee provided an important forum for consideration of issues of interest with trade representatives, and with representatives of the Police and the County Council Highways department as required.

1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 To seek approval for revised licence and registration fees for 2019/20.

2.0 **BACKGROUND**

- 2.1 In accordance with the Council's financial regulations it is necessary for all fees to be annually reviewed.
- 2.2 The services relate to the regulation, control and administration of the following areas:
 - o Private Hire and Hackney Carriage fees;
 - Scrap Metal collectors and sites;
 - Miscellaneous licensing fees.
- 2.3 Fees for the Licensing Act 2003 are set nationally and cannot be altered by the Council.
- 2.4 Fees under the Gambling Act and for sexual entertainment venues are considered by the Licensing committee.
- 2.5 Members are reminded that these are statutory services and as such are not subject to market forces. The Council has discretion about the setting of fees.

3.0 **SCOPE**

- 3.1 In line with council policy a 3% increase is suggested for all fees and charges. A summary of proposed fees is provided at Appendix A which sets out the fees and charges that were agreed in 2016/17 and the proposed increase; the figures have been rounded up or down to assist with cash handling.
- 3.2 At present these budgets have averaged out to the point where there is no material subsidy either way. A 3% increase will maintain that position.
- 3.3 These fees and charges have not been increased for two years.

4.0 **EXCEPTIONAL ITEMS**

- 4.1 On 30 November 2016 this committee decided to retain the limit of 110 hackney carriages. The committee also decided to commission another unmet demand survey in 2019, the survey to be funded by hackney carriage licence holders, for which licence holders are charged £10 at each six month renewal.
- 4.2 The consumable licensing items are subject to price changes by our supplier. Appendix A shows the costs recharged on the current stock but prices will be adjusted when suppliers alter the costs to us.
- 4.3 A comparison of fees within Derbyshire authorities will be available at the meeting.

5.0 **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

5.1 A 3% increase will enable the council to provide these services as close to cost neutral as possible.

6.0 **RECOMMENDATION**

6.1 Approval is given to a 3% increase in fees and charges from 1 April 2019.
