- 1.2 A relevant representation has been made in respect of the application and not withdrawn. The application cannot be granted under officer delegated authority.
- 2.0 Premises Details.
- 2.1 The premise currently holds a club premises certificate, on a residential street.
- 2.2 The following photograph shows the property and its position.



3.0 **Application Details**

3.1 The application was accepted by the Licensing department on 24th July 2023 and seeks a Premises Licence for the venue.

3.2 The applicant wishes to licence the premises as an on licence seeking the sale and supply of alcohol on the premises between 10.00 am and 1.00 am daily. Regulated entertainment – plays, films, live and recorded music, dance, sport and anything similar again daily 10.00am and 1.00am. Late night refreshment daily 11.00 pm and 1.00 am.

4.0 Application Process

- 4.1 Applications for a new Premises Licence are required to be advertised by way of
 - A notice in the local press,
 - a site notice displayed at the premises,
 - copies of the application submitted to the Responsible Authorities
 - and details of the application posted on the Chesterfield Borough Council website.
- 4.2 A copy of the Application Form is attached, along with the current club certificate foe comparision at Appendix A. The premises plan is attached at Appendix B.
- 4.3 The application was advertised correctly, appearing in the Derbyshire Times on 27th July 2023.
- 4.4 The site notices displayed on the premises, advertising the application were viewed by a representor and found to be incorrectly displayed, these being white as opposed to the legal requirement of blue (Appendix C) These notices were subsequently amended by the applicant.
- 4.5 The application was submitted on-line. The Licensing Department circulated a copy to the responsible Authorities on 24th July 2023.

- 4.6 The application was forwarded for inclusion on the Local Authority website on 24th July 2023.
- 4.7 The statutory deadline for representations was 21st August 2023.
- 4.8 Due to the incorrect display of the notices the applicant withdrew the application and formally resubmitted the application on 14th August 2023. Nothing materially had been changed within the application, only the dates of submission and extension to the consultation period.
- 4.9 The application was advertised correctly again, appearing in the Derbyshire Times on 17th August 2023.
- 4.10 The application was submitted on-line. The Licensing Department circulated a copy to the responsible Authorities on 14th August 2023.
- 4.11 The application was forwarded for inclusion on the Local Authority website on 14th August 2023.
- 4.12 The site notices displayed on the premises, advertising the application were viewed by officers on 14th August 2023 (appendix D) and periodically throughout the 28-day period.
- 4.13 Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties (which includes persons or bodies representative of businesses or residents in the vicinity of the premises) are entitled to make representations to the Licensing Authority provided they are relevant representations.
- 4.14 To be relevant, the representation must be made in relation to one or more of the licensing objectives which are: -
 - the prevention of crime and disorder
 - public safety
 - the prevention of public nuisance

- the protection of children from harm
- 4.15 No representation has been received from a Responsible Authority.
- 4.16 One representation from a nearby resident was received and accepted on 9th August 2023. The representor was informed of the withdrawal and resubmission; nothing materially had changed to the application other than the consultation dates. As such the representor wished the representation to be carried forward to the new application and is attached at appendix E.
- 4.17 Further representations were received as below.
 - 16th August 2023, attached at Appendix F.
 - 17th August 2023, along with a petition signed by 23 persons, attached at Appendix G.
 - Further comments were made by the initial representor on 22nd August 2023 along with a map to support these comments, attached at Appendix H (map enlarged for clarity).
 - 28th August 2023, attached at Appendix I.
 - 3rd September 2023, petition signed by 29 persons, attached at Appendix J.
 - 9th September 2023, attached at Appendix K.
 - 11th September 2023, petition signed by 41 persons, attached at Appendix L.
- 4.18 The accepted representations addresses the following issues.

The prevention of crime and disorder

- Anti-social behaviour/damage to property, vehicles etc.
- Representor fears a problem with the 01.00 am terminal hour proposed in this new application.
- Lack of membership signing in will lead to lack control within the premises.

The prevention of public nuisance

- Parking and traffic issues relating to the busy nature of the street and the lack of available parking for residents and users of the premises, potential increase in taxi usage.
- Increased noise and disturbance from users of the venue leaving late at night, and activities taking place from within

General Concerns

The representations express the following opinions.

- Premises situated amongst a number of other licensed premises.
- Premises situated next to a place of worship and possible disturbance to worshippers.
- Late night revellers leaving the premises.
- Increased hours will bring in drinkers from neighbouring establishments.
- Lack of compliance under pub watch guidance
- Possible interaction between children attending school in the morning and human excretions left on the pavement from revellers.

5.0 The licensing objectives, guidance and policy

- 5.1 When carrying out its licensing functions in relation to this application, the Committee must do so in accordance with the provisions contained in the Licensing Act 2003 and with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.

M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The Club comprises a bar, lounge, concert room, 2 pool rooms and a snooker room. During the week the concert room (which can be split into 2 rooms) is used as a community hub by Grassland and Hasmoor Big Local during normal working hours. In the evenings, the Club rents the concert room area out to various local community groups. Live music is performed in the concert room.

In undertaking the above, the Club ensures that it complies with relevant licensing, health and safety, fire safety and any other legislative requirements. We aim to ensure that the Club has a minimal impact on the local community particularly when customers are leaving the premises late at night. We have policies in place to deal with a range of issues such as drug misuse and disciplinary matters as well as safeguarding and we are an active member of Pubwatch.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

All staff are aware of the need to not serve anybody with alcohol if they think that person has already consumed too much. The Club has a strict zero tolerance policy relating to drug abuse with posters to this effect displayed. Staff reserve the right to refuse entry or eject anyone who they think is involved in the sale of drugs and staff are aware that they should call the Police immediately if they think drug use/abuse is taking place. They are also aware that such issues should immediately be recorded in the incident book.

The Club has a door entry system which can only be opened by Club members with a valid members card or by staff from behind the bar. Staff can see who is wanting to get into the Club at all times and can decide whether or not to allow entry before opening the door.

The Club maintains a written incident book and the records shall be kept on the premises for a minimum period of two years for production on request, to a Constable or an authorised officer of a Responsible Authority. Entries in the incident book are reviewed on a regular basis by the Club managing committee and sanctions may be imposed where there have been breaches of Club discipline.

SIA registered door staff will be employed at the discretion of the Designated Premises Supervisor/holder of the Premises Licence as part of their written risk assessment, noting the guidance of Derbyshire Constabulary Licensing.

The Club has CCTV cameras covering all key areas of the premises including entry and exit points. Footage is recorded is recorded in real time and shall be retained 21 days and made available by suitably trained staff onto removable media to the Police or officers of Responsible Authorities upon their reasonable request.

The Club is a member of Pubwatch and the Designated Premises Supervisor or their nominated representative shall retain active membership of the local scheme as long as it shall exist.

No customers shall be permitted to leave the premises with open drinks containers, except for consumption in the designated outside area.

The Club and staff are committed to actively seek to reduce possible anti-social behaviour connected to the premises at the earliest opportunity.

c) Public safety

The Club Administrator is designated as the Health and Safety Officer who is responsible for the day to day management of health and safety issues. The Club also has a designated Fire Safety Officer who deals with all the necessary fire safety checks and paperwork.

All staff carry out visual safety checks during shifts to make sure the Club is safe for public use on an on-going basis. Toilets are inspected at regular intervals. All the necessary certifications in terms of PAT testing, electrical certification, fire certification and environmental health certification are in place and up to date.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Live bands are always finished within our current licensed hours. The volume is controlled to a suitable level. Doors are kept shut when live music is being played. We have notices around the premises asking our customers to leave the premises quietly in order to respect our neighbours. Staff will reserve the right to refuse to serve those who they feel have already had too much to drink.

The Club's CCTV systems covers the exits to the building and the Club reserves the right to take disciplinary action against any members who regularly cause a public nuisance when leaving the building.

On occasions where larger than usual numbers are expected, the Club does employ registered door staff who monitor behaviour of customers entering and exiting the premises and they advise the Club Committee of any issues.

e) The protection of children from harm

The Club allows children up to the age of 11, to stay on the premises until 21:00. Those over 11 can remain in the Club until it closes. In both the above cases, children must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times. Children are not allowed to be served at the bar.

All staff are aware of the Challenge 25 scheme and we display posters stating the staff reserve the right to refuse to serve anyone who they think is underage or who they think may be supplying alcohol to someone that is underage. Anyone who attempts to buy alcohol and who appears to be under 18 will be asked to provide an acceptable form of ID. Any incidents where the sale of alcohol is refused to someone under 18 will be recorded.

Under 18's are not permitted to play on the gaming machines and notices to this effect are on display. In line with the law, the Club operate a strict no smoking policy and under 18's are not permitted in the designated smoking area. Again, notices to this effect are displayed.

Full training to staff is provided on commencement of employment on relevant current legislation and any internal policies and procedures. Refresher training is provided as necessary and records are kept.



Application for Premises Licence - Hasland Club Limited

I am writing this letter in support of my objections under the prescribed headings of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance to the application made by Hasland Club Limited in relation to Hasland Club for a premises licence in respect of various activities, including the sale of alcohol and the provision of late-night refreshment and entertainment.

I am aware that Hasland Club has operated at its present premises for many years, originally as a working men's club, with some entertainment. However, in recent times the club has rebranded itself and become the base for a community hub and it is this change that has presumably brought about the above application.

It is important that the premises and proposed licensed activities are not considered in isolation from the local environment in which the club is situated.

Within relatively close proximity to the club, there are already to be found on Mansfield Road three (3) businesses selling alcohol for consumption on the premises (two (2) public houses and a bar), with a further four (4) businesses selling alcohol for consumption off the premises. The club further sits directly opposite a place of worship, Hasland Methodist Church. Whilst the church does not have services every day, it is normally open for worship (either morning or evening) on a Sunday and worship should not be interrupted or disturbed.

The application seeks a licence for the sale of alcohol from 10a.m. until 1a.m. the <u>following</u> morning, presumably seven (7) days each week, in the absence of any qualification to the contrary. None of the businesses referenced above are open for the sale of alcohol for this amount of time, presumably for the same reasons as set out in this letter in opposition to the Club's application, nor do they have anything like the capacity of the Club. Indeed, one (the bar) is only open during relatively restricted hours and then not every day of the week. Hasland is not like the centre of Chesterfield where there a large number of licensed premises for the sale of alcohol and entertainment as well as a police presence to manage any disorder as well as a nearby police station.

The applicant club is situated in a residential area with private properties abutting the club, as well as the Methodist Church directly opposite the main entrance. The proposed lengthy hours for both the sale of alcohol as well as the provision of entertainment raise the prospect of undue noise and disturbance, in particular late at night, including in the early hours of the morning, whether from the club building itself or those entering or leaving the club as well as motor vehicles. The Club has the potential to accommodate many more revellers than any of the other local licensed premises. If alcohol can be sold and/or entertainment provided until 1a.m., by what time will revellers have left? Two (2) a.m., including during the working week, with consequent disturbance to those sleeping in the

surrounding area? The same applies in respect of 'late night refreshment'. The cut off times are far, far too late for a residential area and are out of step with the nearby licensed premises, referred to above, as well as, in the case of refreshment, to local takeaways.

The Club has an outdoor area adjacent to the building, fronting onto Kent Street. If this were to be used to as late as lam (or later, if allowing drinking up time) there will potentially be noise and disturbance for neighbouring residents as well as the opportunity for anti-social behaviour. At the very least there should be a maximum number of persons in the area at any one time as well as a cut off time for its use, say 8.30p.m., to allow residents respite from any noise at night. Control also needs to be exercised during the daytime to ensure that any noise emanating from the outdoor area is not excessive.

There is also the possibility of anti-social behaviour in the neighbouring streets if revellers (potentially a large number) leave so late. Cars and other property have been damaged overnight on more than one occasion in neighbouring streets and there has been some theft and burglary, but because of the hour and the inadequate street lighting as well as the difficulty in getting police to attend, it has been difficult to bring anyone to book.

Parking for vehicles is extremely limited in the area around the club. Cars driven by those attending the club can at times further exacerbate an already difficult situation for residents and where revellers require transport, taxis or their equivalent will cause further congestion (there not being a taxi rank) and noise, in particular late at night. Any bus services will also have ended long before the proposed closing times. Even noise during the day can cause issues for those who work shifts and sleep during the day (such as NHS workers of which there are quite a few).

I am aware that the Club has members who work for one or more of the local authorities or who may be local councillors. It is important that none of these are involved in any way with any decisions or recommendations by Council officials in respect of the Club's application and I would expect anyone with such connections to recuse, i.e. absent themselves, from anything to do with the Club's application. If necessary, if I am not satisfied with your response on this point, please note that I reserve the right to follow up with a Freedom of Information request.

Finally, on a somewhat pedantic note, the Notice as displayed on the Council website provides instructions for its display at the premises the subject of the application and states that it is to be 'printed on paper of a pale blue colour'. This has not been done and the Notices displayed are on plain white paper and are therefore technically not compliant and should be re-displayed printed on the correct colour paper. I can provide copies of the notices that have been displayed if necessary.

I have spoken about the above application with a large number of my neighbours who have all expressed the same concerns as I have set out above. However, as any objections and the names of those objecting will be put into the public domain, they will most likely prefer to keep their heads 'below the parapet'. In no way does this make the objections set out above any less worthy of consideration and having a bearing on any decision reached on the above application.



I write this letter as a supplement to my letter dated 7th August 2023 in support of my objections under the prescribed headings of Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance to the application made by Hasland Club Limited in relation to Hasland Club for a premises licence in respect of various activities, including the sale of alcohol and the provision of late-night refreshment and entertainment.

My earlier letter referred to the various premises in the immediate vicinity of the Club which sell alcohol. I now attach a map of the area showing their location, the public houses being marked with a black dot and the off-licences marked with a red dot. The residential nature and the density of the properties surrounding and abutting the Club can also be clearly seen.

The proposed licenced hours represent an increase over one week of over 12% from the current hours and an increase of over 13% on weekdays, making the Club's potential hours significantly longer than those of other nearby licensed premises. Further, with a Club Certificate only members can enter the Club premises and sign in guests, meaning that the Club will know who is on the premises at any time and can control the number of people on the premises. This protection against potential anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder would fall away with a Premises Licence. The proposed closing time would bring in drinkers from neighbouring establishments where they may have already consumed more than enough alcohol, with an increased risk of anti-social behaviour and noise.

It is understood that the Club is a member of the local Pubwatch scheme, under which if a member decides to exclude an individual from their premises, it is expected that other members will do the same. However, I have been told anecdotally by the licensee of one of the local public houses, who is a member of the local scheme, that the Club will not exclude an individual excluded elsewhere on the ground that the Club is a club and not a public house. If this is correct, it raises questions about the Club's willingness to keep good order and prevent anti-social behaviour and goes to their fitness to hold a licence for the sale of alcohol.

Kent Street, Hampton Street and Eyre Street East are used six days per week by considerable numbers of children on foot who attend the neighbouring schools as well as classes at the Methodist Church. If the Licence as currently applied for is granted, as a result of the significantly increased opening hours into the early morning as well as the

change and no doubt hoped for increase in those able to enter the Club, there is considerable potential for an increase in anti-social behaviour. This could see children facing the prospect of having to walk down streets with vomit and/or human excretions visible on the pavements and/or private property. It is well known that this occurs in Chesterfield town centre at night, with so-called revellers urinating and/or vomiting in the entrance of the Winding Wheel and other doorways in the centre of Chesterfield in the early hours of the morning. Children (never mind residents) need to be protected from such things.

Whilst Hasland Club describes itself on its Facebook page as being 'a community resource committed to providing a safe environment for our members to meet and socialise', it is interesting to note that there does not appear to have been any engagement with the local community as regards this application and, if granted, the proposed changes that this will inevitably bring to the Club and, if the fears that have been expressed not only by me are realised, the immediately adjacent residential streets.

Finally, your Licensing Officer confirmed (in response to my original letter) that the initial Notice displayed on the Club premises was not in conformance with the rules. Accordingly, the Club had to re-submit their application and re-advertise it. Even then the Club managed to continue displaying one of the original Notices which had to be replaced. If the Club cannot follow what are very simple directions on the Notices themselves, this must raise the question as to how scrupulous they will be in meeting their obligations and responsibilities were the current application to be granted.


If the Licensing Committee decide to grant the Club's application, I would ask that they take into account the points made and issues raised above and in my earlier letter. In all the circumstances, it would be appropriate to impose strict conditions as part of the Premises Licence, including in particular restricted opening hours and restrictions on the use of any outdoor space, as well as noise. Assurances that may be offered by the Club as part of their application will not work as they are precisely that. Ultimately, they have no bite.



My husband and I are residents of Hampton Street, living within 100m of Hasland Club, and most strongly object to the proposed licensing application relating to hours extension [Dated: 14/8/23]

Hampton Street is very much a residential area – in our section alone [20 houses up to the junction with York Street] there are several young families and, at the other end of the spectrum, at least seven senior citizen households.

We do not want and should not be subjected to the noise, disruption and increased footfall which would inevitably follow the granting of the application.

Currently it is infuriating to be disturbed late at night by:

- Noise from the performers the windows to the club are invariably left open
- Noise from cars starting up and car doors banging
- Noise from people coming and going along the street walking down the street shouting their 'Goodnights' they have had a drink, they are relaxed and consequently totally oblivious to the racket they are creating! No matter how many notices are posted requesting "Courtesy for our Neighbours'

But at one o'clock in the morning the situation would be intolerable.

- b) increased anti-social behaviour (including criminal damage) in the vicinity of the Club and surrounding streets.
- c) further parking difficulties in an already overcrowded area with consequent road traffic violations (including parking and drink driving) as the Club has no car park of its own and the nearest public car park is the opposite side of Eastwood Park and is not open at night.
