The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Although this application refers to the clubhouse it has a large expanse of football pitches abutting it which would create difficulties for a recently incorporated company bearing in mind the link between alcohol consumption and crime and disorder.

The neighbouring licensed premises, Old House and Nags Head, have many years of experience selling alcohol to minimise the likelihood of disorderly behaviour.

A badly lit public footpath runs behind the clubhouse and links with other footpaths giving the opportunity for anti social behaviour and access to further residential properties.

Public Safety

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

The original planning application (14/00355/FUL) was for D2 category of use, and the applicant stated the activities as football matches. The current licensing application appears to be more in line with category A4.

The public nuisance factors would be exacerbated if measures were not put in place to ensure the playing fields were not used at the events listed in the application.

The noise from any events in the area reverberates thereby causing noise pollution.

The use of the club house and inevitably, in my opinion, the fields would only

increase the problem of noise pollution and nuisance. Although we have no issue with the use of the field for football matches, we already experience low level noise pollution (shouting and at times bad language), which would only increase with the sale of alcohol.

The planning application for the clubhouse showed provision for 44 car parking spaces. This was understood by the Highway Authority in its consultation response, to resolve the current overspill car parking in the vicinity of the site and not for any additional operation of the site. This is obviously inadequate as currently when there are football tournaments cars are parked at the lower end of the field, only a few metres from residential properties some of them lower than the field. This creates noise and emission pollution. Newbold Back Lane in this area is a narrow and badly maintained road and if vehicles parked here it would create access issues for residents and emergency vehicles. There have already been instances when the lane has been heavily parked and vehicular access has been impossible.

The planning application states their activities as football matches, an extension of these activities would only increase public nuisance and pollution. If outdoor lighting was used it would also cause light pollution not currently experienced by residents and I am sure would not assist the operation of the Barnett Observatory.

Under the Local Plan the site of the former Newbold School is allocated for residential development and I assume this will also be taken into account when considering this application as the rear of the clubhouse is only a few metres from this land.

If use of the clubhouse is to be changed for extended activities it should be confirmed that it was adequately sound proofed.

The intention of the clubhouse was for recreational or sporting purposes on a non-profit making basis. It appears that this ethos is now being ignored.

The application is inappropriate for the area which already has sufficient licensed premises.

The site is allocated as a playing pitch in the Local Plan and the application does not accord with this.


