The entrance to the site is from Newbold Back Lane, accessed via Newbold Road & adjacent to the traffic light controlled junction with Loundstey Green Road. This can be a busy junction at most times of the day and can be particularly hazardous at weekends with vehicles trying to access or enter the Brampton Rovers site before and after matches. Loundstey Green Road is also an arterial route for the ambulance service leaving their depot on Old Road, the sound of their warning sirens being a regular occurrence. I consider that the intensification in use of the site access, particularly when vehicles are leaving the premises following an event, would result in a reduction in highways & public safety at this busy junction, contrary to the licensing objectives.

The application site, previously the sports grounds associated with the former Newbold Community School, ~~is~~ is now used by numerous football teams under the banner of Brampton Rovers. Whereas previous noise disturbance caused by sporting activities were limited to school times, the current permitted use of the site results in public disturbance at the weekends, every Saturday & every Sunday, weather allowing.

This change to weekend activities on site was permitted without any public consultation since it did not constitute a material change of use. However, the proposed use of the sports pavillion as a centre for public entertainment would constitute a major change. The noise levels currently experienced as a result of the existing football activities, although intrusive, are predominantly limited to mornings & afternoons. The proposal to license the premises for a variety of entertainment uses & sale of alcohol for 365 days a year from 8.00 am until midnight would have a significant & damaging impact on the amenity & well being of all neighbouring residents. If the intention is to hold occasional birthday parties & sports evenings as suggested, then surely an application for a Temporary Event Notice, as required, would enable these events to take place.

We consider that the licence now proposed would create an unnecessary, unwanted & inappropriate nightspot in the middle of a quiet residential area, contrary to the licensing objectives.
