Proposed Amendments to Terms of Reference of Taxi Consultative Committee (A410)

1 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1 To propose amendments to the terms of reference of the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Consultative Committee (Taxi Consultative Committee), with the aims of:
 - Strengthening the representative role and nature of trade representatives;
 - Clarifying the nomination and appointment process for trade representatives to the Committee;
 - Reinforcing the importance of good attendance and contribution of members to meetings of the Committee;
 - Enhancing continuity of representation.

2 BACKGROUND

2.1 The Taxi Consultative Committee was established in March 2011 as an informal consultative body for the Council and the taxi trade locally in Chesterfield.



- 2.2 Membership of the Committee comprised three hackney carriage licence holders, three private hire licence holders and three elected Members.
- 2.3 The terms of reference were amended in April 2012 to include reference to two of the places for taxi trade representatives (one from each of the hackney carriage and private hire sectors) being filled by members who represent minority ethnic members of the trade, if such nominations were made, and that if more than six trade members were nominated, then the elected Members of the Committee would decide which trade members should be appointed having regard in particular to equalities.
- 2.4 Nominations have been invited annually from trade members on a selfnomination basis, either in writing in advance or by attending an annual nominations meeting of the Committee.
- 2.5 In each of the last three years more than six trade members have been nominated, resulting in the majority of those nominated and in attendance at the nominations meeting agreeing which six members would be appointed and proposing two reserve members (one for each of the hackney carriage and private hire sectors). In the last two years one nomination has been of a member of the trade representing minority ethnic members, and this member has therefore been appointed.

3 PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

- 3.1 The process of self-nomination does not support the principle contained within the purpose of the Committee of acting as 'a representative body for the whole hackney carriage and private hire trade, ensuring consultation with all licence holders'.
- 3.2 One option would be to establish a system for the election of trade members from the two 'constituencies' of all hackney carriage licence holders and all private hire licence holders. However, this would be a time consuming and bureaucratic process for whoever would organise such an election, be that officers of the Council or members of the trade or an independent third party.
- 3.3 It is therefore proposed that each nomination should be supported by a minimum number of other licence holders (hackney carriage or private hire as appropriate), in order to demonstrate that the person nominated has the support of members of the trade. It is suggested that the support of ten other licence holders is a practically reasonable number.
- 3.4 The process of allowing nominations to be made at the nominations meeting can lead to uncertainty and a lack of clarity as to the number of

- nominations being made for each of the hackney carriage and private hire sectors.
- 3.5 It is therefore proposed that nominations be submitted in writing in advance, with the signatures of the required number of supporters as proposed in paragraph 3.3 above, including clarification of whether the nomination is as a representative of hackney carriage or private hire licence holders and whether it is as a member of the trade representing minority ethnic members.
- 3.6 Where more than six nominations of trade representatives are made, it is recognised that it is preferable for the decision on which six are appointed to be made by the trade representatives, rather than the elected Members of the Committee, if possible. However, when this decision has been made by a majority of those nominated representatives who are present at the nominations meeting some trade members have felt dissatisfied and excluded.
- 3.7 It is therefore proposed that if more than six trade members are nominated, the majority agreement of all those nominated (not just those present at the nominations meeting) be required as to which six nominations be put forward to the Council, subject to at least two places being filled by members who represent minority ethnic members of the trade if such nominations are made. In the event of there not being majority agreement of all those nominated, the elected Members of the Committee would decide which trade members should be appointed having regard to achieving as wide a representation as possible from different operators and drivers and to equalities issues.
- 3.8 It is also proposed that the opportunity for appointing one reserve for each section (hackney carriage or private hire) to participate in meetings in the absence of one of the other three representatives be included.
- 3.9 The importance of members attending the meetings is recognised within the existing terms of reference. Attendance at meetings has generally been good, although concern has been expressed that if members miss 'three consecutive meetings without good reason or sending apologies' (the current level at which members would forfeit their place), their contribution to the Committee would be too limited.
- 3.10 It is therefore proposed that the level at which members forfeit their place on the Committee be reduced to missing 'two consecutive meetings without good reason'.
- 3.11 Appointment of trade representatives to date has only been for one year. As meetings of the Committee are only scheduled quarterly appointment for a

- longer period would enhance continuity of representation, in addition to reducing the administrative requirements of inviting nominations and making appointments each year.
- 3.12 It is therefore proposed that the appointment of trade representatives be for a period of two years.
- 3.13 The proposed changes outlined in paragraphs 3.5, 3.7, 3.8, 3.10 and 3.12 above to the terms of reference are included in the draft revised Terms of Reference document attached at Appendix A.

4 <u>CONSULTATION</u>

- 4.1 Initial proposals to amend the Terms of Reference were discussed with trade representatives at the Taxi Consultative Committee on 25 January, 2017. Trade representatives raised concerns about some of the proposals at that stage.
- 4.2 The Chair of the Taxi Consultative Committee met with one of the trade representatives and the Democratic and Scrutiny Officer outside of the meeting, leading to revised proposals being submitted to the Taxi Consultative Committee meeting on 19 April, 2017. These revised proposals (as detailed above in this report) were supported by trade representatives at the meeting.

5 EQUALITIES IMPACT ASSESSMENT

5.1 A full equalities impact assessment has not been completed but retaining within the terms of reference the provision for two of the places for taxi trade representatives (one from each of the hackney carriage and private hire sectors) being filled by members who represent minority ethnic members of the trade, if such nominations are made, demonstrates positive action for minority ethnic members to be represented.

6 RISK MANAGEMENT

6.1 A full risk management assessment has not been completed but it is anticipated that the proposed amendments will enhance consultation between the Council and the taxi trade.

7 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 7.1 That the Appeals and Regulatory Committee approves the proposed amendments to the Terms of Reference of the Taxi Consultative Committee detailed above.
- 7.2 That the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy be amended to include the revised Terms of Reference of the Taxi Consultative Committee.
- 7.3 That nomination of trade representatives for a two year term from June 2017 be invited in accordance with the revised terms of reference.

8 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8.1 The proposed amendments to the Terms of reference of the Taxi Consultative Committee will:
 - Strengthen the representative role and nature of trade representatives;
 - Clarify the nomination and appointment process for trade representatives to the Committee;
 - Reinforce the importance of good attendance and contribution of members to meetings of the Committee;
 - Enhance continuity of representation.
