- * Nottingham City - "Wheelchair Accessible Taxi" means a licensed hackney carriage, that has been constructed or adapted for side loading in order to board, secure and alight a mobility impaired person seated in, at the least, a standard wheelchair without the need to remove that person from the wheelchair, in addition to other able bodied fare paying passengers (i.e. London style hackney vehicles). DfT approval has been granted for wording re. wheelchair accessible taxis to be used on Bus Lane Signing.
- ** Nottingham City - also have a couple of restrictions in the core of the city centre that allow either "permit holder" or "authorised vehicles". Both these descriptions allow Private Hire Vehicles (either for pre-booked fares or at certain times of the day).
