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The prevention of Crime and Disorder

We are opposed to the submitted opening hours the late closure of 2am at weekends and bank holidays will increase the amount of crime and disorder in the local vicinity.

Extended drinking hours will attract a large amount of already intoxicated customers it has already been proven when the premises were last open (Only till 1am) there was a major unacceptable increase to anti social behaviour in the adjacent residential vicinity, including people urinating up our and other residential properties when leaving the premises, weekly fighting amongst groups as well as domestics well into the early hours. There was also lots of intoxicated people been sick on our property and surrounding pavements as well as broken glass.

The premises previously had a bad reputation for drug use, no measures have been included in the new application for the prevention of drug use on the premises.

We would like for an earlier closing time to be considered at weekends / bank holidays and on Sunday an weekday nights.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Our main objection is the application for a change of use and to include the rear yard into a licenced area.

Previously the rear yard has only been used as a none licenced smoking area not allowing people to bring drinks outside. Even with this restricted use it has proved to be a big factor in the Public nuisance previously experienced from this premises.

We have suffered major sleep disturbance , being woke up several times a night from raised voices/shouting from customers using the yard as well as from the internal music when people entering and exiting the yard through the back doors into the building .

During the summer months we have had to stop our young child playing in his own garden because of the inappropriate language and behaviour from customers using the yard.

This has been very detrimental in the past to my families Health and well being.

It states in the Noise Management Plan that outdoor speakers are going to be installed into the rear yard but there is no mention in the licence application that any live or recorded music is to take place outdoors. I would object to music being played outdoors knowing the problem we already have suffered in the past with just people using the yard to smoke.

When the Red Lion was originally built in the early 1900's it was not designed to contain modern levels of sound and vibration and the noise will inevitably escape from the premises and cause unreasonable excessive noise to cause local sleep disturbance.

I would like some condition considered to be placed on the licence to help prevent noise disturbance

1. Ensure all windows and doors are shut when recorded and live music is being played.
2. Ensure all windows and doors are shut after 10pm to reduce customer noise.
3. Install a lobby system to the rear doors of the property to reduce noise escaping to the rear yard if being used by staff or customers.
4. Install a noise limiter, to keep noise to a pre set acceptable level.
5. Reduce the low frequency content of the music to eliminate some of the bass noise penetrating our surrounding property.
6. The rear yard not to be used after 10pm.
7. Boundary Acoustic Screening added to the rear yard to stop some of the chatter noise.

Another item we would like considering before granting the licence.

Reducing the closing time to 1am weekends/Bank Holidays and 11pm Weekdays and Sundays to stop late night noise from:

Vehicles - Taxi's, customers and staff cars (doors opening, closing, horns)

With no onsite parking available on the premises more of the customers and staff will be forced to use adjacent residential streets to park.

People - The coming and going of customers & Staff.
