

b) THE PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER CONT.

NUMBER OF CUSTOMERS FROM LEAVING THE PREMISES AT THE SAME TIME.

THE DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR WILL BE A MEMBER OF A POLICE FORCE SO LONG AS IT EXISTS.

TWO DOOR STAFF, APPROVED BY REGULATING SECURITY INDUSTRY WILL BE PRESENT ON FRIDAY AND SATURDAY EVENINGS FROM TIMES AS WE CONSIDER APPROPRIATE, CERTAINLY FROM 21.00 HOURS ONWARDS, OR EARLIER WHEN THERE IS PERIOD APPROPRIATE TO PREVENT CRIME AND DISORDER. THE REQUIREMENT FOR DOOR STAFF AT OTHER TIMES WILL BE ASSESSED BY THE LICENSE HOLDER. AT ALL OTHER TIMES E.G. HIGH CATEGORY FOOTBALL MATCHES, ADDITIONAL SIA STAFF TO THE TWO MANDATORY SIA DOOR STAFF WILL BE EMPLOYED AT THE PREMISES AT THE DISCRETION OF THE DPS AS PART OF THEIR RATION RISK ASSESSMENT NOTING THE GUIDANCE OF DERBYSHIRE CONSTABULARY LICENSING. A WRITTEN 'JOB DESCRIPTION' DETAILING THE ROLE REQUIREMENTS OF DOOR STAFF SHALL BE MAINTAINED. A CURRENT COPY SHALL BE KEPT AT ALL TIMES AT THE PREMISES AND MADE AVAILABLE UPON REQUEST TO THE POLICE. ALL DOOR STAFF EMPLOYED AT THE PREMISES WILL WEAR HIGH VISIBILITY JERSEYS. RATION RECORDS OF DOOR STAFF EMPLOYMENT WILL BE KEPT ON THE PREMISES FOR A MINIMUM OF TWO YEARS AND PRODUCED UPON REQUEST TO A CONSTABLE OR AN AUTHORIZED OFFICER OF A RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY.

RECORDS WILL INCLUDE DOOR STAFF BADGE NUMBERS AND SIGNING IN AND OUT TIMES.

RANDOM SEARCHING IS MADE A CONDITION OF ENTRY. ALL SEARCHES MUST BE UNDER SUPERVISION AND WITH THE CUSTOMER'S CONSENT. CLEAR, LEGIBLE AND PROMINENT NOTICES MUST BE DISPLAYED EXPLAINING THIS POSITION.

A WELL MAINTAINED CCTV SYSTEM INSTALLED WITH 31 DAYS RECORDING WITH ACCESS GRANTED TO DERBYSHIRE CONSTABULARY TO ENABLE FORWARDING OF FOOTAGE TO MEMORY STICK / DVD IF ANY INCIDENTS OCCUR.

6) PUBLIC SAFETY CONT.

NUMBERS ARE LIMITED TO 240 PERSONS AND THIS WILL BE CONTROLLED BY DOOR STAFF AT BUSY TIMES AND THE DPS.

WRITTEN RECORDS OF SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS WILL BE CREATED AT ALL TIMES. THESE RECORDS SHALL BE KEPT AT THE PREMISES FOR A MINIMUM OF TWO YEARS AND PRODUCED TO A CONSTABLE OR AN OFFICER OF RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY ON REQUEST.

FULL TRAINING ON RELEVANT ASPECTS OF LICENSING ACT 2003 IS TO BE PROVIDED TO STAFF ON THE COMMENCEMENT OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT. TRAINING WILL BE COMMENSURATE WITH THE LEVEL OF RESPONSIBILITY. TRAINING DOCUMENTATION IS TO BE RETAINED ON THE PREMISES FOR A MINIMUM OF TWO YEARS AND PRODUCED TO A POLICE OFFICER OR AUTHORIZED OFFICER OF A RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY ON REQUEST.

TRAINING WILL BE REFRESHED AT LEAST 6 MONTHLY FOR ALL STAFF MEMBERS AND DOCUMENTED.

A SYSTEM RECORDING ALL SALE REFUSALS WILL BE CREATED AT ALL TIMES. AT LEAST WEEKLY, THE DPS (OR AUTHORIZED DEPUTY) WILL EXAMINE THE RECORD AND COMPARE IT AGAINST THE NORMAL OPERATING PATTERN FOR THE PREMISES, INDICATING ANY ACTION TAKEN IN RELATION THE REFUSAL RECORD SHALL BE KEPT ON THE PREMISES FOR A MINIMUM OF TWO YEARS AND PRODUCED UPON REQUEST TO A POLICE OFFICER OR AUTHORIZED OFFICER OF A RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITY.

e.) THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM CONT.

IF CUSTOMERS ORDERING ALCOHOLIC DRINKS APPEAR UNDER 25 THEY WILL BE CHALLENGED AND ASKED FOR PROOF OF AGE AND THOSE UNDER 18 WILL BE PERSONS SOURCE.

CHALLENGE 25 WILL BE PERFORMED AT ALL TIMES AND ANY PERSONS APPEARING TO BE 25 OR YOUNGER WILL BE QUESTIONED AND CHECKED FOR I.D. BOTH ON THE DOOR AND AT THE BAR/SERVERY. FAILURE TO PRODUCE SATISFACTORY PROOF OF AGE WILL RESULT IN A REFUSED SALE. CLEAR, PROMINENT AND UNOBSTRUCTED SIGNAGE WILL BE DISPLAYED AT ALL PUBLIC ENTRY POINTS AND AT POINTS OF SALE. THERE WILL BE NO ADULT THEMED ACTIVITY TO ONE ELSE TO CHILDREN IN RESPECT OF CHILDREN.

**APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – LICENSING ACT 2003
BAR CENTRO, 5 HOLYWELL STREET, CHESTERFIELD**

On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, I give formal notice of objection in respect of the application for a Premises Licence in relation to the premises known as Bar Centro, 5 Holywell Street, Chesterfield.

An application has been made by Shaun Noble for a Premises Licence to authorise live music, recorded music and the sale of alcohol from 10:00 hrs to 03:00 hrs Sunday to Thursday and 10:00 hrs to 04:00 hrs Friday and Saturday at 5 Holywell Street, Chesterfield. The proposed Designated Premises Supervisor is Nicholas Carter.

The premises known as Bar Centro, under the control of Shaun Noble and Nicholas Carter, was recently the subject of a Review under the Licensing Act 2003 relating to the sale/supply of drugs in the premises. Consequently, the Premises Licence was revoked.

We have looked at the application and found that the applicant appears to have given no consideration to the illegal activities which took place at the premises and which ultimately led to the original licence being put forward for review by Derbyshire Constabulary. The application appears to show no change in the character of the premises, from the description, plan and hours proposed.

The premises is situated in what is known as the 'Cumulative Impact Zone' established by Chesterfield Borough Council. We consider that a new premises licence would have an adverse impact on the propensity for disorder in the late night economy.

Derbyshire Constabulary are satisfied that the granting of the application would undermine the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety objectives.

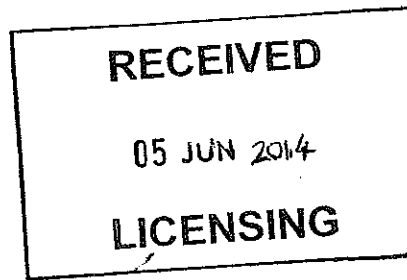

Dear Kate,

I wish to make a representation against the recent application for a premises licence by Mr Shaun Noble for 'Bar Centro', 5 Holywell Street, Chesterfield on the grounds that it will add to the cumulative impact of crime and disorder.

Bar Centro was subject to an expedited review brought by the police regarding drug dealing that amounted to serious crime. That process resulted in the premises licence being revoked by the licensing committee on 13 January 2014. Mr Nick Carter, then premises licence holder, appealed against that decision but his appeal was dismissed by magistrates' court on 28 May 2014.

The current application is for the same hours and purpose as the revoked licence with the same individuals involved in the management. The current application is made by the previous licence holders' business partner, Mr Noble, with Mr Carter as designated premises supervisor.

The council has adopted a special policy (a Cumulative Impact Policy) that includes Holywell Street. The Cumulative Impact Policy created a rebuttable presumption that a new application relating to premises in the designated area will be refused if objections are received from Responsible Authorities and/or Interested Parties. Applicants for licences or certificates need to demonstrate that they will not add to the problems in the designated area.

I feel that the application has failed to provide the necessary reassurances with regard to the cumulative impact of crime and disorder.

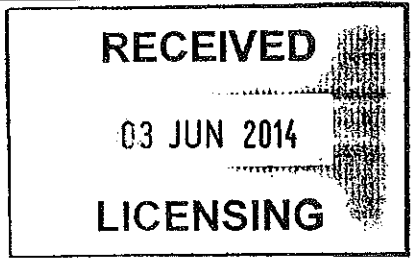

Further to our phone conversation just now. I would like to amend my objection to this application, so could I withdraw my email of 16:24hrs on 2/6/14 and make the following representation against this application.

I am writing this email to formally make a representation against this application under the objective Protection of Public Nuisance.

Parts E & F of the application form state that the applicant wants live and recorded music outside (up) till 0400 hrs on Saturdays and Sundays, and 0300 hrs. on all other days.

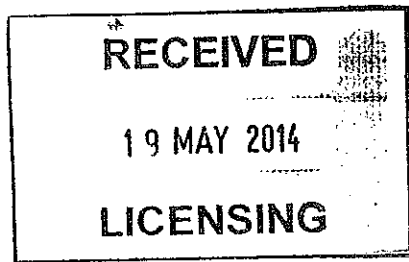
Whilst I appreciate that this may not mean that such regulated entertainment outside will always be present till those hours, bearing in mind the fact that the rear courtyard of Bar Centro is next to a block of flats (Townwalk) I strongly object to the applicant being granted outdoor live or recorded music after 2230 hrs. on any day, and also I would like to see conditions placed on the premises requiring windows and doors being closed after this time when regulated entertainment is happening, should committee be minded to grant this application.

However in saying this, as the application stands, my representation is to refuse the application.

I further note that the location of this premise lies within the Cumulative Impact Zone, and as such there is a presumption that new applications would not be allowed if it potentially adds to existing issues in that zone. As there is no premises licence for this application site, allowing a venue which wants to play live and recorded music until 4am on Saturdays and Sundays, and 3am on other days , both indoors and outdoors could have a negative impact on the local environment.



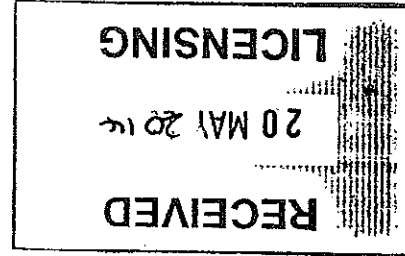
