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BACKGROUND PAPERS FOR PUBLIC REPORTS:

1.0 **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 To present for approval the Council's revised Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Policy Statement, and to adopt and delegate enforcement powers under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1 That the Anti-Social Behaviour Policy be approved, published and widely circulated.
- 2.2 That the delegations listed in Appendix B are approved and the appropriate amendments to the Council's constitution are made.

- 2.3 That the level of fixed penalty under section 52 of the Act for failing to comply with a Community Protection Notice be set at £70, payable within 14 days and references to statutory notices and fixed penalty notices within the Council's Enforcement Policy Statement shall be construed to include Community Protection Notices
- 2.4 That the Chesterfield Community Safety Partnership Community Safety Officer be designated as the single point of contact for the Community Trigger and act as co-ordinator for the partnership response.

3.0 **BACKGROUND**

- 3.1 The current Anti-Social Behaviour Policy was last reviewed in 2009, In light of recommendations of the Ombudsman that the Council should develop a comprehensive policy and procedure to deal with anti-social behaviour across the Council.
- 3.2 Due to recent legislative changes including the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 and emerging best practice in the field, the Anti-Social Behaviour Policy has now been revised.

4.0 **REVISED POLICY**

- 4.1 The new revised Anti-Social Behaviour Policy is attached at Appendix A. This policy sets out the Council's commitment to reducing anti-social behaviour, improving the quality of life for local people and reducing crime and fear of crime within our communities.
- 4.2 Chesterfield Borough Council is developing supporting operational guidance and has introduced an IT system to manage anti-social behaviour cases. This system (ECINS) is a multi-agency data base and is supported by Derbyshire Information Sharing Agreement.
- 4.3 Chesterfield Borough Council and Chesterfield Community Safety Partnership employees have undertaken a range of learning and development via Safer Derbyshire in order to effectively implement the new anti-social behaviour interventions and requirements contained within the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. Elected members have also received briefing sessions on the new powers and ECINs.

5.0 **MONITORING**

5.1 The Anti-Social Behaviour Policy will be monitored via the delivery of the Community Safety Action Plan and associated performance measures. The Policy will be reviewed in 2019/20.

6.0 **CONSIDERATIONS**

6.1 Risk Management - This work concerns the implementation of statutory and good practice performance requirements. All relevant documents and reports have to be published and available for public scrutiny.

The Home Office impact assessment identifies positive impacts including: protecting people's freedoms and civil liberties, while protecting our citizens from terrorism; and simplifying and strengthening powers to protect the public from sexual harm.

8.4 That the Chesterfield Community Safety Partnership – Community Safety Officer be designated as the single point of contact for the Community Trigger and act as co-ordinator for the partnership response.
